FINGERPRINTING

Effective Monday, May 5th - all fingerprinting at the Steamboat Springs Police Department will be conducted on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. The fee for fingerprinting is \$5.00 per set.

This does not include Sex Offender Registration fingerprinting. This will be conducted 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

SPRING CLEANUP

The City Street Department will be sweeping up scoria and small branches that have fallen from trees/bushes throughout the winter. Residents should rake the debris onto the street shoulder.

Please do not take advantage of this small service by having large piles in the streets for pick up. All branches that have been trimmed or trees that have been cut down, as well as other debris, must be hauled away by the resident or contractor.

SPRINGTIME TIPS FOR PROTECTING YOUR HOME AGAINST FIRE

- Request a fire inspection of your home or business for fire safety by calling Steamboat Springs Fire Prevention at (970) 871-8216.
- Regularly clean your roof and gutters.
- Keep household items accessible to be used as fire tools such as, a rake, axe, handsaw or chainsaw, bucket, shovel, and a ladder that will reach the roof.
- Identify and maintain an adequate outside water source such as a small pond, cistern, well, swimming pool, or hydrant. Have a garden hose that is long enough to reach any area of the home and other structures on the property.
- Clean out storage areas. Don't let trash such as old newspapers and magazines accumulate. Check electrical wiring. Inspect cords for frayed or exposed wires or loose plugs. Do not overload extension cords or outlets. If you need to plug in two or three appliances, get a UL-approved unit with built-in circuit breakers to prevent sparks and short circuits.
- Never use gasoline, benzene, naphtha or other flammable liquids indoors. Store them in approved containers and well-ventilated storage areas and never smoke near them. Safely discard all rags or items soaked in a flammable liquid.
- Make sure home insulation does not touch electrical wiring.
- Know the locations of the gas valve and electric fuse or circuit breaker box and how to turn them off in an emergency. If you shut off your main gas line for any reason, allow only a gas company representative to turn it on again.
