- No Glass Allowed

- Respect Other River Users
- Respect Private Property
- No Dogs Allowed
- No Nudity
- No Alcohol
- Avoid Standing and Walking on the Riverbed

PEDESTRIAN/DRIVER SAFETY TIPS

Pedestrians

- ⇒ Stop at the curb before crossing. Look left, right, then left again to check for traffic before crossing a street.
- ⇒ Cross at intersections. Try to use marked crosswalks.
- ⇒ Watch for vehicles turning right – you may be difficult for drivers to see.
- ⇒ Walk on the sidewalk. Where there is no sidewalk walk opposite the flow of traffic, facing on-coming traffic.
- ⇒ See and Be Seen:
 - Be visible
 - Wear bright colors
 - Wear reflective clothing at night
 - Make eye contact with drivers before crossing

Drivers

- ⇒ Yield to pedestrians.
- ⇒ Obey the speed limit.
- ⇒ Minimize distractions. Avoid using cell phones when driving downtown.
- ⇒ Always come to a complete stop before turning right on a red – and look up and down the sidewalk for pedestrians.
- ⇒ Watch for pedestrians around parked vehicles.
- ⇒ Be courteous.
