



Dear Steamboat Springs Community Member:

As you may know, the City is undertaking a formal search for our new City Manager, in conjunction with an experienced executive search firm. A vital part of this search is input and participation from our community. City Council is seeking direct citizen involvement through a City Manager Search Committee. **We seek your application for this committee by August 13.**

There are many factors to consider when selecting the new City Manager; experience, education, problem solving abilities, communication skills, interest, motivation, community involvement and interpersonal skills to name a few.

City Council seeks a six (6) member committee to include 5 interested community members and 1 city employee. We estimate this committee will meet approximately 2 hours per week for 4-6 weeks (more time at the interview stage) to assist in the following:

1. Identify attributes and skills needed by candidates for the City Manager
2. Work with City Council and the executive search firm of Peckham and McKenney during the recruitment process (assist in development of candidate questionnaires, review finalist resumes, participate in interviews, meetings with candidates, etc.)
3. Make recommendations to City Council

In addition to the 6 member committee, our executive recruitment firm will interview various community agencies and groups (i.e. Routt County, Yampa Valley Housing Authority, Chamber, Ski Corp, etc.) to get input on the selection of the next City Manager.

PINE BARK BEETLES

The City is contacting community members to help combat the Pine Bark Beetle epidemic in Northwest Colorado that is now entering our urban forests. Property owners are being asked to remove dead or dying trees and take precautionary measures to protect any threatened trees per Chapter 24 "Trees and Shrubs" of the Steamboat Springs Municipal Code. ATTENTION ALL TUBERS

The City's Yampa River Management Plan recommends all private tubers put on the river at or below Fetcher Park in order to minimize human impacts on the upper stretches of the river. Take out shall not occur any further downstream than the Stockbridge Multi Modal Center. Commercial tubing must put in at or below the 5th Street Bridge. The following rules apply to everyone:

- No Glass Allowed
- No Littering
- No Styrofoam Coolers
- Respect Other River Users
- Respect Private Property
- No Dogs Allowed
- No Nudity
- No Alcohol
- Avoid Standing and Walking on the Riverbed

ATTENTION DOG OWNERS A DOG LICENSE IS MANDATORY IN THE CITY AND COUNTY

A yearly license is required for all dogs within the city limits of Steamboat Springs and within Routt County limits. You may acquire a license at the Animal Shelter located at 760 Critter Court, Monday – Friday 12:00-5:30 p.m., Saturday, 12-4:00 p.m. and Sunday, 12-2:00 p.m. Bring your rabies certificate. The license is \$5.00 for altered dogs and \$25.00 for unaltered dogs.

Please remember to keep your dog on a leash six feet or less and under control.

SUMMARIZED FROM THE MODEL TRAFFIC CODE FOR COLORADO (2003)

Drivers

Drivers emerging from an alley, driveway, or parking lot that crosses a sidewalk must yield to pedestrians on or about to enter the sidewalk.

At unsignalized intersections drivers shall yield, slow, or stop as needed to give pedestrians the right-of-way within a crosswalk.

Drivers shall exercise due care to avoid pedestrians.



Pedestrians

Obey pedestrian signals. When at a signalized intersection – start crossing only when given the "Walk" indication.

Do not suddenly leave the curb and move into the path of a moving vehicle.

Don't cross diagonally.

Cross at intersections downtown, don't jay walk.

Where no sidewalk is provided, walk on the shoulder. Where no shoulder is provided walk on the opposite side of the road facing traffic as far to the roads edge as possible.
