CONSTRUCTION DETOURS ON LINCOLN AVENUE

Construction work will be continuing through November 15th on Lincoln Avenue between 3rd Street and Old Fish Creek Falls Road as crews upgrade public water, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer infrastructure.

During this time there will be varying detours as they try to accomplish the work safely, quickly, and with the least amount of disruption feasible. Periodic updates will be provided on the City Page as work progresses.

The current phase of work involves installation of a new box culvert on the shoulder of Lincoln Avenue between the Post Office and Old Town Hot Springs, and installation of curb and sidewalk on the opposite shoulder of Lincoln Avenue adjacent to the old Blimpies restaurant. Both shoulders of Lincoln Avenue will be closed in order to complete the work.

All local businesses will remain open during construction. Two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained. Congestion is anticipated, and alternate routes are advised.

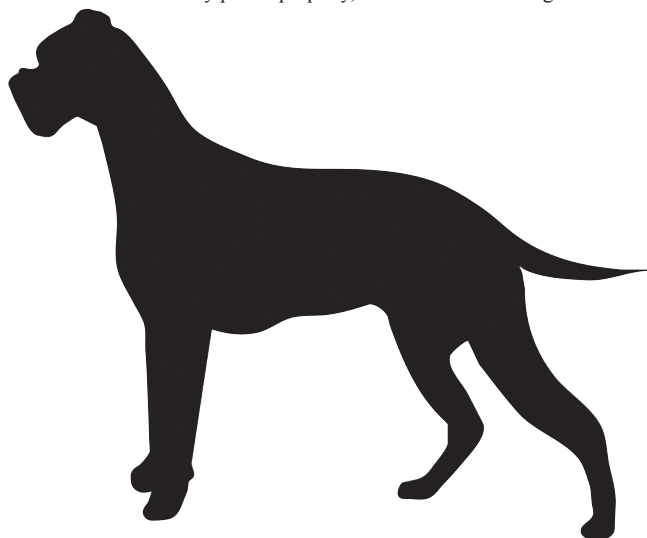

HOW CAN A DOG BE ON A LEASH AND YET BE CONSIDERED "AT LARGE?"

Have you ever been walking on the street or in the park and been frightened by the bark, growl or lunge of a dog tethered to a post or tree? The dog is probably frightened also.

Please be aware that Sec. 4-10 (e) of the Steamboat Springs Revised Municipal Code reads: "A dog shall be considered running at large if the dog is left unattended on any public property, whether or not the dog is secured by a leash, cord, chain or other means..."

Please be respectful of others and your dog and do not leave your dog unattended in a public place. You could be cited for Dog at Large. The first offense is a \$50.00 fine.

TIS THE SEASON...FOR POLITICAL SIGNS

THE BELOW SECTIONS OF THE CODE WILL GUIDE YOU TO SIGN COMPLIANCE:

Section 26-222. Prohibited Signs. Any sign placed in a corner sight triangle, on any curb, sidewalk, post, pole, hydrant, bridge, tree, or other surface located on, over, or across any public street, right of way, property or thoroughfare.

Section 26-221. Political campaign signs must be located on private property with the property owners consent, shall not be located within the city right of way and must be removed no later than seven (7) calendar days from the date of the election.

GREEN MACHINE RECYCLING CENTER

The Green Machine is available for FREE public recycling at the following locations in November:

A Green Machine will be permanently located at Alpine Bank in Steamboat Springs.

- November 3 – 10 Steamboat Springs Rodeo Grounds
- November 10 - 17 Town of Yampa – Ladies Aid Hall
- November 17 - 24 Steamboat Springs - Safeway Parking Lot
- November 24 – December 1 Town of Oak Creek - Alley Behind Colorado Bar

Green Machines are emptied on Mondays and may be unavailable briefly.

The following items may be recycled in the Green Machine:

- #1 through #7 plastics - NO pesticide/motor oil containers or plastic bags,
- aluminum, steel, tin - includes foil products, glass, paper – NO neon colored paper, magazines, phone books, catalogs, paperboard, cardboard - includes pizza, snack, and noodle boxes, corrugated cardboard.

Please DO NOT Contaminate your recycling with trash and plastic bags!

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Parking problems are compounded by winter snow, which accumulates fast with each storm. In order to expedite snow removal efforts, parking is prohibited on City streets and shoulders during the following hours from NOVEMBER 1 through APRIL 30.

Location	Restricted Hours
Lincoln Avenue:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Ski Time Square:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Anglers Drive area	
And south to city limits:	Midnight to 8 a.m.
All Other Areas:	2 a.m. to 8 a.m.

Your vehicle may be ticketed if left on City streets within the restricted hours or towed during snowplow operations within the restricted hours.
