



## NOON WHISTLE

Did you know that our noon whistle was first located at the Steamboat Laundry – now Creekside Café – in the 1930's and the whistle actually ran off the laundry's steam vent?

The noon whistle we had until a couple of weeks ago was mounted in the '50s. We can resurrect our whistle with your contributions. No contribution is too small. If we raise the \$4000 necessary to resurrect the whistle, the City will continue to pay the operations and maintenance costs. You can vote with your contribution to:

- Clean and repair the old whistle and remount it on a new pole: or.
- Purchase a new whistle that mimics a steamboat whistle (additional costs)

And locate it at:

- The same location at 8th and Oak; or
- Howelsen Hill directed toward our downtown

## CONSTRUCTION DETOURS ON LINCOLN AVENUE

Construction work at Lincoln Avenue and 3rd Street is nearly complete for the season! This week there will be varying detours as they try to accomplish the work safely, quickly, and with the least amount of disruption feasible. Periodic updates will be provided on the City Page as work comes to a close.

The current phase of work involves construction of a box culvert inlet on the shoulder of Lincoln Avenue between the Post Office and Old Town Hot Springs, and installation of curb and sidewalk on the opposite shoulder of Lincoln Avenue adjacent to the old Blimpies restaurant. Both shoulders of Lincoln Avenue will be closed in order to complete the work.

All local businesses will remain open during construction. Two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained. Congestion is anticipated, and alternate routes are advised.

## WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Parking problems are compounded by winter snow, which accumulates fast with each storm. In order to expedite snow removal efforts, parking is prohibited on City streets and shoulders during the following hours from NOVEMBER 1 through APRIL 30.

Location	Restricted Hours
Lincoln Avenue:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Ski Time Square:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Anglers Drive area	
And south to city limits:	Midnight to 8 a.m.
All Other Areas:	2 a.m. to 8 a.m.

Your vehicle may be ticketed if left on City streets within the restricted hours or towed during snowplow operations within the restricted hours.
