BUILDING PERMIT FEE INCREASE

The City of Steamboat Springs is considering adopting a fee schedule in an effort to cover the costs associated with administering building permits. The Routt County Regional Building Department charges a building permit fee to cover their costs; however, the current fee does not cover any of the City's staff time spent on permit review.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Parking problems are compounded by winter snow, which accumulates fast with each storm. In order to expedite snow removal efforts, parking is prohibited on City streets and shoulders during the following hours from NOVEMBER 1 through APRIL 30.

Location	Restricted Hours
Lincoln Avenue:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Ski Time Square:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Anglers Drive area	
And south to city limits:	Midnight to 8 a.m.
All Other Areas:	2 a.m. to 8 a.m.

Your vehicle may be ticketed if left on City streets within the restricted hours or towed during snowplow operations within the restricted hours.
