OVER-DUE PARKING CITATIONS WILL BE SENT TO COLLECTIONS

Effective immediately, registered owners of vehicles with overdue City of Steamboat Springs parking citations issued between January 1, 2006 – present must pay their over-due fines on or before April 30, 2009. Beginning May 1, 2009, parking citations 45 days or more in arrears will be sent to a collections agency. For those with three or more citations, the vehicle maybe immobilized (booted) until full payment is received OR a citation may be issued requiring a mandatory Court appearance. To inquire whether a parking citation has been issued for your vehicle, call the Parking Citation Inquiry Line at (970) 871-8255.

SPRING CLEANUP
