New Properties Listed to the Steamboat Springs Register of Historic Places

Five additional significant properties were designated to the Steamboat Springs Register of Historic Places by the Historic Preservation Commission on June 4, 2009. Two National Register designated properties including the Steamboat Springs Depot (1000 13th Street) and the First National Bank (803/807 Lincoln Avenue), were listed as Historic Landmarks. Three Historic Resources were also designated: the Carver Power Plant (124 10th Street), Carver House (927 Oak Street) and Iron Springs Park (1300 Lincoln Avenue).

These recent additions to the City's Historic Register bring the total to eight listed properties. Previously designated properties include Howelsen Hill, the Lithia Spring and a private residence at 270 River Road in Brooklyn. Properties listed on the Steamboat Springs Register may be eligible for tax benefits and other financial incentives.

The Historic Register was established by ordinance in February of this year and is designed to preserve, protect, enhance, and perpetuate the exteriors of those buildings, structures, objects, sites and districts that reflect outstanding elements of the City's cultural, artistic, social, economic, political, architectural, historic or other heritage.
