Landscaping This Summer?

The City Public Works Department would like to remind all homeowners to avoid placing large landscape materials such as berms, trees, and boulders within 10-15 feet of the street driving surface. This right-of-way area, which is typically 30 feet from the centerline of street, is used for snow storage and utility line installation. Landscape materials may damage street maintenance equipment or have to be removed because of utility work in the area.

The City will not be responsible for damage to landscaping materials or irrigation systems, etc. that are placed within any public right-of-way.

Your cooperation now will help the snowplow crews provide timely and cost effective snow removal service in the future, and will help utility companies avoid damage to your landscaping during excavation procedures.

Wildlife Proof Trash Container Reminder

Per City of Steamboat Springs Ordinance 1973, wildlife proof trash containers must be used if refuse is put outside anytime before 6:00 am on scheduled pick-up day or left outside after 8:00 pm that evening.
