Four City Council positions: three 4-year positions representing each of the election districts of the City, and one 2-year at-large position, will be voted upon at the general municipal election (part of the Routt County coordinated election) to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2009.

Eligible candidates must be 18 years of age or older on the day of the election. They must have resided in the municipality for a period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election, and they must be a resident of the District that they will represent. All Steamboat Springs City Council elections are non-partisan campaigns.

Attention all Property Owners:

Colorado State Law requires that all land owners manage noxious weeds on their properties. Whitetop is one of the first noxious weeds to appear and can be found throughout the area. The plant has white flowers, is capable of vigorous growth and produces many seeds that remain viable for many years.

The Steamboat Springs Community Development Code enables fines of up to \$999.00 per day/per violation for private property owners not in compliance with the Routt County Weed Plan.
