Four City Council positions: three 4-year positions representing each of the election districts of the City, and one 2-year at-large position, will be voted upon at the general municipal election (part of the Routt County coordinated election) to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2009.

Eligible candidates must be 18 years of age or older on the day of the election. They must have resided in the municipality for a period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election, and they must be a resident of the District that they will represent. All Steamboat Springs City Council elections are non-partisan campaigns.

The City of Steamboat Springs has processed its first application using the incentives adopted with the new Historic Preservation Ordinance. Congratulations to the owners of 270 River Road, listed on the City of Steamboat Springs Register of Historic Places, whom have taken advantage of the planning fee and tap fee waivers associated with its designation!

The citizens of Steamboat Springs are invited to apply to serve a two or three-year term on one of two Community Support Money Allocation Committees:

- Arts and Culture Coalition Allocation Committee
- Environment Coalition Allocation Committee

Each Allocation Committee represents a coalition of community nonprofit organizations and determines funding recommendations for Coalition member organization. Recommendations are then forwarded to the Community Support Steering Committee for presentation and approval by the City Council, after the City annual Budget is approved.
