Team Pain has completed the concrete Skatepark project at the Bear River Park (old sewage lagoons) located behind the Routt County Justice Center. Unfortunately, this does not mean that it is open for use as ongoing decommissioning of the sewage lagoons is still occurring.

The City of Steamboat Springs along with the Steamboat Skatepark Alliance would like to invite you to a soft opening on Saturday, November 14th from 9:00 am – 4:00 pm (weather permitting) to enjoy the new concrete Skate Park that was ten years in the making.

Directions: West on Highway 40 to Lagoon Court, left on Lagoon Court (slow on dirt road). Balloons will mark the turn on Highway 40.
