## Winter PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Parking problems are compounded by winter snow, which accumulates fast with each storm. In order to expedite snow removal efforts, parking is prohibited on City streets and shoulders during the following hours from

**November 1 through April 30.**

<b>Lincoln Avenue:</b>	<b>3 a.m. to 6 a.m.</b>
<b>Ski Time Square:</b>	<b>3 a.m. to 6 a.m.</b>
<b>Anglers Drive area</b>	
<b>And south to city limits:</b>	<b>Midnight to 8 a.m.</b>
<b>All Other Areas:</b>	<b>2 a.m. to 8 a.m.</b>

Your vehicle may be ticketed if left on City streets within the restricted hours or towed during snowplow operations within the restricted hours.

## ENTERPRISE ZONE PROGRAM EXPIRES JANUARY 1, 2010

At its meeting on August 18, 2009, City Council determined that the Enterprise Zone program succeeded in its intent to encourage new businesses and expansion of businesses in the designated industrial enterprise zone, and unanimously voted to allow the program to expire on January 1, 2010, as originally intended.

As of January 1, 2010, the Enterprise Zone exemption from City Sales and Use Tax is discontinued.

The discontinuance of this exemption includes but is not limited to: Supplies, building materials, parts, equipment, machinery, machine tools, trucks, automobiles, construction machinery, construction equipment and utilities including electric, gas, and telephone services.
