SIDEWALKS NEED TO BE KEPT CLEAR OF SNOW AND ICE

Please be aware that you are responsible for removing snow from the sidewalks in front of or adjacent to your building between November 20th and April 15th under the Steamboat Springs Municipal Code.

Failure to do so could result in a Citation.

Fines Associated with this violation are as follows:

\$50 First Offense plus \$20 Surcharge

\$100 Second Offense plus \$20 Surcharge

\$200 Third Offense and subsequent Offenses plus \$20 Surcharge

New this year...Routt County License for your pet available at your Vet. Get your pet's annual wellness check, vaccines and license all at the same time. It's one stop shopping at its best! Or you can take your pet's rabies vaccination certificate to the Steamboat Springs Animal Shelter, 760

Critter Court, to obtain a Routt County License.

The cost is only \$5.00 if your pet is spayed or neutered. If you live in the City of Steamboat Springs or in Routt County, a yearly Routt County

License is mandatory.

(Hayden, Oak Creek and Yampa require city licenses.)

BE SAFE!

Please clear the snow and ice from all your car windows, headlights and taillights before driving your car.

Remember to turn on your headlights in bad weather.

Winter PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Parking problems are compounded by winter snow, which accumulates fast with each storm. In order to expedite snow removal efforts, parking is prohibited on City streets and shoulders during the following hours from

November 1 through April 30.

Location	Restricted Hours
Lincoln Avenue:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Ski Time Square:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.

Anglers Drive area	
And south to city limits:	Midnight to 8 a.m.
All Other Areas:	2 a.m. to 8 a.m.

Your vehicle may be ticketed if left on City streets within the restricted hours or towed during snowplow operations within the restricted hours.
