THE STEAMBOAT 700 REFERENDUM ELECTION will be held March 9, 2010 and will be an ALL MAIL BALLOT.

Please be aware that the last day to register to vote in this election is February 8, 2010. You may register to vote up to this date at the Routt County Clerk and Recorder's Office.

If you are not going to be at your regular mailing address during this time, you may request that your ballot be mailed to a different address (mail ballots will not be forwarded). An "application for absentee" form is available on the City's website at www.steamboatsprings.net/departments/city_clerk/voter_information

or you can pick this form up at the front desk of City Hall, 137 10th Street.

The application shall be filed no later than the close of business on the Friday immediately preceding the election; except that, if the applicant wishes to receive the mail-in ballot by mail, the application shall be filed no later than the close of business on the seventh day before the election.

Additionally, if you did not vote in the November 2009 election, your voter status was changed to "inactive" and therefore you would not receive a ballot in the mail. To change your voter status back to "active", complete and return the "application for mail ballot by an inactive voter" form. This form is available at City Hall or on the City Clerk's webpage and may be filed anytime up until March 9, 2010.

Proposed Changes to Waterbody Setbacks, Wetland, and Floodplain Development Regulations:

- Limit the type and amount of development within waterbody setbacks.
- Allow for administrative variances to waterbody setbacks.
- Limit filling of wetlands and floodplains.
- Require new structures in floodplains to be elevated an additional foot above the flood elevation.

Winter PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Parking problems are compounded by winter snow, which accumulates fast with each storm. In order to expedite snow removal efforts, parking is prohibited on City streets and shoulders during the following hours from

November 1 through April 30.

Location	Restricted Hours
Lincoln Avenue:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.
Ski Time Square:	3 a.m. to 6 a.m.

Anglers Drive area	
And south to city limits:	Midnight to 8 a.m.
All Other Areas:	2 a.m. to 8 a.m.

Your vehicle may be ticketed if left on City streets within the restricted hours or towed during snowplow operations within the restricted hours.
