



City Hall & Centennial Hall Reopen After Spring Break

Public Hours Run Monday through Thursday From 12pm to 5:30pm

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, COLORADO-April 21, 2021-City offices including City Hall, across the street in Centennial Hall and Parks & Recreation will reopen after Spring Break with limited hours starting Monday, April 26, 2021.

City services that span Planning, Finance, City Clerk, City Manager, Deputy City Manager, Public Works, Utilities – Water & Sewer, Engineering, Parks & Recreation and Municipal Court will be open to the public Monday through Thursday from noon to 5:30pm. City offices will remain closed to the public on Friday.

Masks are required when entering all city buildings and physical distancing measures are also in place. In addition, touchless methods and protective protocols continue to enhance distancing between individuals while inside the buildings.



The box outside the main entrance to City Hall continues to provide a secure means to drop off payments and documents outside these hours. All online channels remain available to citizens.

Starting on Tuesday, May 4, City Council plans to move to a hybrid meeting format with a mix of councilors in-person in Citizen's Hall and others attending virtually. Capacity limits will continue to dictate the number of citizens permitted indoors for council meetings. Citizens can continue to participate in council meetings virtually via Zoom.
