



Short-Term Rental Listening Session Set For May 10 *City Council Holds Special 90-Minute Meeting for STR Public Comment*

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, COLORADO-May 6, 2022-Steamboat Springs City Council will hold a special listening session on Short-Term Rentals on Tuesday, May 10, starting at 7pm and immediately following the regularly scheduled work session earlier that evening.

The work session, which starts at 5pm in the Carver meeting room in Centennial Hall, will look at Private Facilities on Public Land and Fiscal Sustainability: Short-Term Rental Tax. Each item is scheduled for 45 minutes, but the work session will end prior to 7pm regardless of if the topic has been completed.

The Listening Session will kick off with a brief presentation by Planning & Community Development Director Rebecca Bessey at 7pm. After the approximately 15-minute overview of Short-Term Rentals and the Overlay Zone, the public will be able to address city council with their thoughts on the subject. Public comment will end promptly at 8:30pm.



Once Council President Robin Crossan opens public comment, citizens will be asked to queue at the podium and be prepared to speak. Each person should identify themselves with their full name and address and complete their comment in three (3) minutes or less.

The Listening Session will be in city council chambers, also referred to as Citizens Hall, as well as televised on TV6/Comcast and streamed online via Zoom. Public comment is provided in-person and through Zoom during the Listening Session.
